

The Lynchings In Duluth



On June 15, 1891, three African American circus workers, Elias Clayton, Elmer Jackson, and Isaac McGhie, suspects in an assault case, were taken from the jail. On the evening of June 15, 1891, in Duluth, Minnesota, three young black men, accused of the rape of a white woman, were pulled from their jail cells and lynched. On June 15, 1891, police arrested several young black men accused of raping a white woman. That evening, three of them—Elias Clayton, Elmer Jackson, and Isaac McGhie—were taken from jail by a mob and lynched. Minnesota's black community established the Duluth Branch of the NAACP. This updated, second edition of *The Lynchings in Duluth* includes a new preface by the author, additional research and notes, and suggestions for further study. By the 1890s, lynchings of African Americans had become a standard practice across the nation.
