Concern	Description of a Few Concerns of Anti-Federalists
protecting liberties	no Bill of Rights—no written guarantee that national government will protect individual liberties
large republic	no real common interests in such a large republic; people's interests overlooked
states v. national	state power will be eroded by Constitution; supremacy clause; etc.
national government	too powerful; congressional power to levy taxes and tariffs may hurt general public; citizens might be harassed by a standing army; elected officials had no term limits
slavery	some argued the <i>Constitution</i> gave too much power to slave states
